Purpose The course provides a forum for supervisors to enhance their supervision knowledge and skills and to become familiar with current supervision practices, research, and literature. It is designed to meet the requirements of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT) refresher course requirements. The course may be used for continuing education hours.

Focus The course focuses on practical/clinical, theoretical, legal, ethical, professional, research, and relationship issues related to supervision and supervision mentoring. There is an emphasis on supervision from a postmodern collaborative perspective--drawing on the metaphors of social construction and narrative theories-- within the broader context and history of systemic/family therapy theories.
